Student will bring:

- Handbuilding tools ([this set](#) is recommended, but similar is fine)
- Stainless steel carving set ([this set](#) is recommended, but similar is fine)
- Kemper steel scraper ([this](#))
- [Mudtool yellow rib](#)
- Small paint brushes ([this set](#) is recommended, but similar is fine)
- Container with a lid for scrap clay/slip
- Seasonally appropriate clothing (it's usually hot!)

Optional:

- Reusable water bottle (optional, but strongly recommended!)
- Bug spray
- Sunscreen
- Rain gear
- Beach gear or hiking gear if you hope to do those things in your off time
- Anything under "Pocosin provides" that you would rather bring from home
